Filipina New Yorker receives nine international awards

Carissa Villacorta, the 27-year-old author of the book *Surreality*, garnered four communicator awards, including an Award of Excellence for the copywriting of *Surreality*. The book was published by the UST Publishing House in celebration of the school's 400th anniversary.

Villacorta, together with her creative director John Paul Su of JPSU Multimedia Productions, also received two Platinum Hermes Creative Awards as author of the book and as writer and executive producer of its promotional video. The Hermes Creative Awards is an international competition for creative professionals involved in the concept, writing and design of traditional materials and programs, and emerging technologies, administered and judged by the Association of Marketing and Communication Professionals, consisting of several thousand members. Hermes award makers are the same makers of the Golden Globe.

Villacorta also received three Bronze Telly Awards for her *Surreality* video in three categories: Excellence in Low-Budget Productions, Promotional Pieces, and Promotional Music Video.
